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5 Education of Homeless Children

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7 Every child of a homeless individual and every homeless child are entitled to equal access to the same
8 free, appropriate public education as provided to other children with permanent housing. The District
9 must assign and admit a child who is homeless to a District school regardless of residence and
10 irrespective of whether the homeless child is able to produce records normally required for enrollment.
11 The District may not require an out-of-District attendance agreement and tuition for a homeless child.

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13 Should a child become homeless over the course of the school year, the child must be able to remain at
14 the school of origin, or be eligible to attend another school in the district.

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16 The Superintendent will review and revise as necessary rules or procedures that may be barriers to
17 enrollment of homeless children and youths. In reviewing and revising such procedures, the
18 Superintendent will consider issues of transportation, immunization, residence, birth certificates, school
19 records, and other documentation.

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21 Homeless students will have access to services comparable those offered to other students, including but
22 not limited to:

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24 1. Transportation services;
25 2. Educational services for which a student meets eligibility criteria (e.g., Title I);
26 3. Educational programs for children with disabilities and limited English proficiency;
27 4. Programs in vocational and technical education;
28 5. Programs for gifted and talented students; and
29 6. School nutrition program.

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31 The Superintendent will give special attention to ensuring the enrollment and attendance of homeless
32 children and youths not currently attending school. The Superintendent will appoint a liaison for
33 homeless children.

35 A “homeless individual” is defined as provided in the McKinney Homeless Assistance Act.

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37 Anyone having a concern or complaint regarding placement or education of a homeless child will first
38 present it orally and informally to the District homeless liaison. Thereafter, a written complaint must be
39 filed in accordance with the District Uniform Complaint Procedure.
